

PARK INCIDENT REPORTING POLICIES

It should be noted that all park patrons use the Off Leash Dog parks under their own risk. DOLA (Dog Owners' Liability Act) can apply to all dog owners anywhere in the City of London.

If an occurrence happens and is reported to the London Dog Owners Association (LDOA) the following procedure is followed:

- * All reports should be directed to the Off Leash Parks Liaison.
- * Records are compiled and kept on the following:
 - o Date of incident
 - o Information about who was involved. This can include some or all of the following:
 - Description of human and/or canine
 - Vehicle description, year, make, model, colour or plate number
 - Name and phone numbers of those directly involved in the incident as well as any witnesses to the incident.
 - o What was the occurrence? The Off Leash Park Liaison will try to talk to anyone involved to get all aspects of the incident. This can also include witnesses.
- * Depending on the information given and the severity of the incident the Police and/or London Animal Care Centre (LACC) may be called and/or notified.
- * The Police and LACC may also be called if we get too many complaints on one individual.
- * If the Police or LACC are involved we do not receive any further information.

Note:

If an occurrence is reported directly to the City of London, LACC or Police the LDOA may or may not be made aware of it, which is why we ask you to contact us directly.
